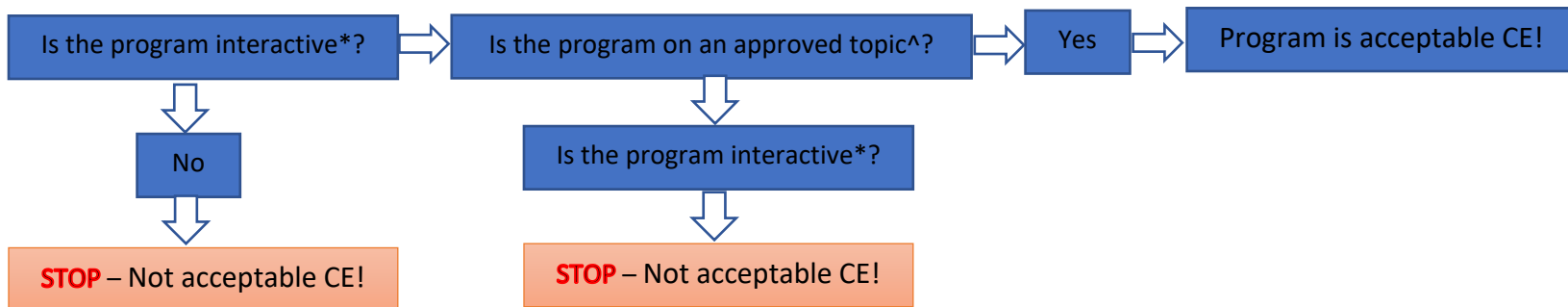


## General Requirements for All CE Programs

- ➔ Must have significant intellectual or practical content;
- ➔ Primary objective must be to improve professional competence;
- ➔ Topics of clinical benefit to consumers;
- ➔ Instructors qualified by education or experience to provide instruction in the subject matter;
- ➔ Presented in a setting suited to the educational activity of the program;
- ➔ Content based upon scientific evidence generally accepted by the profession.

Once you conclude that a program meets the general requirements listed above, use this flow chart to make your final determination if a program is acceptable **CHIROPRACTIC CE**:



**\*Interactive means:** Programs in which you are able to interact with and speak with the instructor. A program may be conducted via teleconference so long as the instructor can speak directly with and interact with attendees.

**Online CE means:** interactive online learning over the internet.
